BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES - The incumbent assumes responsibility for balancing and reconciling retirement payroll accounts for four retirement systems in terms of their effect on assets, liabilities and equities of the department. Prepares SOAR Journal Vouchers to record retirement payroll with required accounting code elements, input data into the District of Columbia R-STARS Accounting Systems to post transactions into the agency's general ledger accounts. Reviews Balance Sheet Vouchers for terminated employees retirement contributions refund requests, input data into the District R-STARS accounting system to record and post transactions to debit agency ledgers liability accounts and credit cash. Updates bi-weekly Special 1099R System to record taxable amount of refund payments to employee to be reported to IRS at year-end.

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIREMENTS - One (1) year of Specialized Experience is required. In addition – Applicant must have a degree in accounting; or a degree in a related field such as business administration, finance, or public administration that included or was supplemented by 24 semester hours in accounting. The 24 hours may include up to 6 hours of credit in business law, or a combination of education and experience-at least 4 years of experience in accounting, or an equivalent combination of accounting experience, college-level education, and training that provided professional accounting knowledge. The applicant's background must also include one of the following: (1) Twenty-four semester hours in accounting or auditing courses of appropriate type and quality. This can include up to 6 hours of business law. (2) A certificate as Certified Public Accountant or a Certified Internal Auditor, obtained through written examination; or (3) Completion of the requirements for a degree that included substantial course work in accounting or auditing.

SPECIALIZED EXPERIENCE: Experience that has provided the applicant with the particular knowledge, skills, and abilities to perform successfully the duties of the position, and that is typically in or related to the work of the position to be filled. To be creditable, specialized experience must have been equivalent to at least the next lower grade level in the normal line of progression for the occupation in the organization.

1. Knowledge of generally accepted accounting principles, concepts, and theories and the ability to apply them to theoretical and actual financial problems with versatility and judgement.
2. A thorough knowledge of payroll accounting including payroll transactions, and payroll and financial system interface transactions.
3. A thorough knowledge of IRS depositing and reporting rules and requirements.
4. The ability to organize, analyze, interpret, and evaluate payroll and financial data in the solution of management and accounting problems and the projection of results based on the alternatives selected.
5. A thorough knowledge of financial reporting and internal control systems to develop appropriate and efficient systems for controlling and tracking payroll expenditures of the District government.

SUBSTITUTION OF EDUCATION FOR EXPERIENCE WILL BE ALLOWED AS DEFINED BY OPM'S X-118, QUALIFICATIONS STANDARDS. HOWEVER, IN ORDER TO RECEIVE CREDIT, YOU MUST SUBMIT OFFICIAL PROOF OF EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT WITH YOUR APPLICATION. TIME-IN-GRADE REQUIREMENTS ARE APPLICABLE. RESIDENCY PREFERENCE AMENDMENT ACT OF 1998: An applicant for a position in the Career Service or for an attorney position (DS 905) in the Excepted Service who is a bona fide resident of the District of Columbia AT THE TIME OF APPLICATION, may claim a hiring preference over a non-resident applicant by completing the 'Residency Preference for Employment' form, [DC 2000RP](#), and submitting it with the employment application, [DC 2000](#). To be granted preference, an applicant must: (1) be qualified for the position; and (2) submit a claim form at the time of application. Except for employees entitled by law to preference, preference will not be granted unless the claim is made at the time of application.

NOTICE OF NON-DISCRIMINATION

In accordance with the D.C. Human Rights Act of 1977, as amended, D.C.
