Conclusion

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2019 through 2022 budget and financial plan to implement the bill.

Background

The bill requires¹ the Department of Behavioral Health (DBH) to issue rules to establish criteria to determine whether mental health rehabilitation services² are medically necessary. The rules must be submitted to Council for a 45-day review period. Currently, medical necessity criteria are not uniformly interpreted across all providers in the District.

Financial Plan Impact

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2019 through 2022 budget and financial plan to implement the bill. DBH can absorb the cost of developing new mental health rehabilitation rules within existing resources. No additional funds are needed to implement the bill.
