Conclusion

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2018 through fiscal year 2021 budget and financial plan to implement the bill.

Background

The bill clarifies¹ that businesses that only maintain a registry of qualified nurses, and do not directly employ nurses, are not required to be licensed as nurse staffing agencies in the District of Columbia. The bill also clarifies² the difference between home care agencies and nurse staffing agencies by specifying that nurse staffing agencies provide personnel and not nursing services.

Financial Plan Impact

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2018 through fiscal year 2021 budget and financial plan to implement the bill. The Department of Health can implement the bill without additional resources.
