Conclusion

Funds are not sufficient in the fiscal year 2024 through fiscal year 2027 budget and financial plan to implement the bill. The bill's implementation will cost \$250,000 across fiscal year 2024 and fiscal year 2025.

Background

The bill requires the Office of Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Questioning Affairs (Office) to produce a report on Black LGBTQ+ history in the District. The Office will research the unique history of the Black LGBTQIA+ community, the Black Pride Movement, and their contributions to culture, activism, education, and other areas. The Office will also review the impact of the AIDS crisis and how policy decisions made during the crisis still impact the Black LGBTQIA+ community. The report should include recommendations on how best to include Black LGBTQ+ history in District's public social studies curriculum.

The bill requires the Office to hold at least two public meetings and a public comment period for the report. The Office should also consult with individuals who have experience in the District's Black LGBTQ+ community and other experts on the topic when compiling the report.¹ The Office should

submit the report to the Mayor, Council, the District of Columbia Archives, and the DC Public Library's People's Archives by May 1, 2025.

The bill establishes the seven-member² Advisory Committee (Committee) to provide guidance and feedback on the Office's development of the report. The Committee should meet no more than once per month for up to one year, sunsetting upon completion of the report. The Committee should submit final commentary, recommendations, and dissenting opinions to be included in the final report. The bill authorizes a stipend of up to \$100 per Committee member per meeting as well as reimbursement³ for expenses incurred by the Committee or individual members.

Financial Plan Impact

Funds are not sufficient in the fiscal year 2024 through fiscal year 2027 budget and financial plan to implement the bill. The Office will engage with contractors to support research, community outreach, staffing, and report compilation. The Office requires \$250,000 across fiscal year 2024 and fiscal year 2025 to support developing the report, which could take approximately one year to complete, and to support any advisory committee stipends or reimbursements as needed.
