



Conclusion

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2024 through fiscal year 2027 budget and financial plan to implement the bill.

Background

Elizabeth Catlett was born in Washington, D.C. and attended Howard University. Catlett earned a Master of Fine Arts from the University of Iowa where she used various mediums to portray African American life. Her sculptures and prints have been displayed in over fifty solo exhibitions at museums and galleries.¹ Catlett passed away in Mexico City, Mexico in 2012.

The bill officially designates the public alley system within the block bounded by Georgia Avenue, N.W., Crittenden Street, N.W., 9th Street, N.W., and Buchanan Street, N.W. as Catlett Alley, N.W.

Financial Plan Impact

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2024 through fiscal year 2027 budget and financial plan to implement the bill. The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) will fabricate and install four signs to officially designate the roadway as Catlett Alley, N.W. The signs will cost \$1,840 and DDOT can absorb the cost within its existing budgeted resources. DDOT will work with all relevant District agencies to ensure the official street designation is established.
