Conclusion

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2024 through fiscal year 2027 budget and financial plan to implement the bill.

Background

Concealed pistol licenses and firearm registration certificates are issued by the Metropolitan Police Department (MPD). An individual who is denied a concealed pistol license or firearm registration certificate or has an existing license or certificate revoked may file an appeal. In 2023, on a temporary basis, the Council transferred jurisdiction over concealed pistol license appeals from the Concealed Pistol Licensing Review Board (CPLRB), which is now disbanded, to the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) as of October 1, 2023.¹ This legislation also required the Mayor to transfer all records from CPLRB to OAH and that all cases or motions filed at CPLRB before October 1, 2023 should be redocketed at OAH. OAH had previously only adjudicated firearms registration certificate appeals. Temporary legislation also changed the burden of production of evidence and the burden of

persuasion for an appeal of a denial or revocation of a concealed pistol license or a firearm registration certificate from the applicant or licensee to the Chief of MPD.²

The bill makes these changes permanent.

Financial Plan Impact

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2024 through fiscal year 2027 budget and financial plan to implement the bill. OAH received an additional administrative law judge, deputy clerk, and legal assistant in the fiscal year 2024 budget to support the new authorities granted to the agency. These resources are sufficient to make the changes permanent.
