SUBJECT: Fiscal Impact Statement – Southwest Waterfront Park Bus Prohibition Act of 2018

Conclusion

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2019 through fiscal year 2022 budget and financial plan to implement the bill.

Background

The bill prohibits bus parking on any streets located adjacent to or within the District's Southwest Waterfront Park area. This area is generally bounded by 6th Street, S.W., Maine Avenue, S.W., and the Anacostia River.¹ The prohibited area includes Water Street, S.W. and 6th Street, S.W.,² but does not include Maine Avenue, S.W. The bill sets a fine of \$150 for a violation of this prohibition.

This prohibition is currently in effect under temporary legislation.³

Financial Plan Impact

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2019 through fiscal year 2022 budget and financial plan to implement the bill. The bill makes permanent the temporary prohibition, which the Department of Public Works (DPW) currently enforces. DPW can enforce the permanent prohibition within its existing budgeted resources.
