## Conclusion

Funds are sufficient in the proposed FY 2014 through FY 2017 budget and financial plan to implement the bill.

## Background

The bill allows the Mayor to issue a driver's license, permit, or identification card to a resident who meets the following qualifications:

- 1. A District resident for greater than 6 months;
- 2. Ineligible to obtain a social security number;
- 3. Possesses an individual identification number issued by the Internal Revenue Service;
- 4. Does not possess documentation authorizing his or her presence in the United States from the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services; and
- 5. Provides a valid, unexpired passport from the applicant's country of citizenship or a foreign birth certificate<sup>1</sup>

Any applicant must then meet all the requirements related to fees, examinations, age, and other eligibility requirements associated with a driver's license, permit,<sup>2</sup> or identification card.<sup>3</sup> The

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driver's license and identification card will be valid for eight years while the permit is subject to the requirements set forth in current law.<sup>4</sup>

Lastly, the bill increases the fee to obtain or renew a license from \$44 to \$47 starting on October 1, 2015.

## **Financial Plan Impact**

Funds are sufficient in the proposed FY 2014 through FY 2017 budget and financial plan to implement the bill. There are approximately 25,000 undocumented residents living in Washington, DC.<sup>5</sup> In order to implement the bill and accommodate the increased workload, the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) will need to spend \$550,000 in FY 2014 for public outreach and system and document upgrades. Additionally, DMV will need to hire four new staff members at a cost of \$241,000 in FY 2014 and \$1 million over the four year financial plan period.

If roughly 70 percent of the residents who would be eligible under this program took advantage of a license, permit, or identification card, approximately \$967,000 would be generated in FY 2014. Combined with the \$3 increase in the cost of a new or renewed driver's license starting in FY 2016, the bill will generate \$1.8 million over the four year financial plan period.
