## Conclusion

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2019 budget and the fiscal year 2020 through fiscal year 2023 budget and financial plan to implement the resolution.

## Background

The resolution approves proposed rulemaking by the Department of Health (DOH) to allow dispensaries, cultivation centers, and testing laboratories (facilities) to change ownership or location.

The rulemaking implements provisions of an existing law<sup>1</sup> to allow for change of ownership of facilities with approval from DOH. At least 30 days prior to any transfer of majority ownership or control (50 percent or more of ownership of interest or common stock), facilities must obtain approval from DOH. If there is a change in minority ownership (a person owning between 1 and 50 percent of common stock), the rules require facilities to notify DOH within 15 calendar days of the change. Within 15 days following notification, any new minority owner, partner, or stockholder must apply for a registration with DOH.

The rulemaking also requires facilities to request approval from DOH for a change or expansion 30 days prior to executing any agreements with a landlord or builder. Any move is subject to review by the affected Advisory Neighborhood Commission and cannot result in more than two dispensaries or six cultivation centers being registered to operate within a single Ward.

## **Financial Plan Impact**

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2019 budget and the fiscal year 2020 through fiscal year 2023 budget and financial plan to implement the resolution. The Department of Health can implement the rules without additional resources.
