#### Conclusion

Funds are sufficient in the FY 2005 through FY 2008 budget and financial plan to implement the provisions of the proposed approval resolution. No additional staff or resources will be required to implement the proposed municipal regulations.

### Background

The proposed legislation would approve new municipal regulations to prohibit the removal, or remove by special permit Special Trees<sup>1</sup> located in the District of Columbia. The proposed municipal regulations require that a certified arborist determine whether a tree is eligible for Special Tree protections. The proposed rules make an exception for the removal of Special Trees when a person or property is in imminent danger, or when the Special Tree is interfering or disrupting utility activities.

The proposed new rules require that when a Special Tree is removed that a replacement tree is planted. The replacement tree is not required to be planted at the same location that the Special Tree was removed from.

The proposed rules require that a permit be obtained to remove a Special Tree. The permit's applicant will be required to pay an amount equal to \$35 per inch of girth of the Special Tree. These funds will be deposited into the Tree Fund.<sup>2</sup>
