Conclusion

The proposed legislation would result in a negative fiscal impact on the local General Fund of \$131,000 in FY 2007 and an overall impact of \$359,000 for FY 2007 through FY 2010.

Background

The proposed legislation would amend Chapter 8 of Title 47 of D.C. Official Code to exempt from taxation real property that is part of a planned unit development or within the jurisdiction of a property owners association and is restricted to use as a common area or open space. In addition to providing a property tax exemption, this proposal would amend D.C. Official Code §42-1102 and §47-902 to exempt these same common area parcels or open space from deed recordation and transfer taxes. The proposed legislation would be retroactive to October 1, 2005, requiring forgiveness or a refund of any real property taxes, deed recordation, or transfer taxes owed or paid on qualifying common area or open space properties.

Financial Plan Impact

It is estimated that the proposed property tax exemption will cost an estimated \$116,000 in FY 2007 (including a refund of \$56,000 for Tax Year 2006) and \$320,000 in FY 2007 through FY 2010. The Office of Tax and Revenue (OTR) will require additional resources in order to

implement the provisions of the proposed legislation. The table in Figure 1 illustrates the estimated revenue impact on the District's financial plan and the operational costs associated with implementing the legislation. In total, the proposed legislation would result in a negative fiscal impact on the local General Fund of \$131,000 in FY 2007 and an overall impact of \$359,000 for FY 2007 through FY 2010.
