Conclusion

Funds are sufficient in the FY 2007 through FY 2010 budget and financial plan submitted to Congress to implement the provisions of the proposed legislation. No additional staff or resources will be required.

Background

The draft Committee Print combines the following bills into one bill, Bill 16-586:

- Bill 16-586, the "Metropolitan Police Department Applicant Obligated Service Amendment Act of 2006";
- Bill 16-706, the "Service of Process of Police Officers Act of 2006";
- Bill 16-788, the "Retired Police Longevity Amendment Act of 2006";
- Bill 16-820, the "Metropolitan Police Department Educational Requirement Amendment Act of 2006".

In addition, the Committee Print includes a provision that would cover a group of firefighters who retired between 1980 and 1987. The provision would adjust the benefit amounts of these retirees to account for the inclusion of longevity compensation. The Committee Print also amends Section 2055 (14)(A) of the Fiscal Year 2007 Budget Support Act of 2006 (D.C. Act 16-

476) to require the Metropolitan Police Department to maintain the total percent of sworn officers assigned to the police districts as existed on June 11, 2006.

Financial Plan Impact

Funds are sufficient in the FY 2007 through FY 2010 budget and financial plan to implement the proposed legislation. The additional contributions to the police and fire pension fund would begin in FY 2008. The annual additional contributions are minimal and can be accommodated by the fund.
