



Conclusion

Funds are sufficient in the FY 2008 budget and proposed FY 2009 through FY 2012 budget and financial plan to implement the provisions of the proposed legislation.

Background

The proposed legislation would amend the Litter Control Administrative Act of 1985² to require pedestrians stopped by a police officer or other authorized official to inform the officer or official of his or her true name and address. It would also amend Section 2221 of Title 18 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations to state that individuals shall not dispose litter from moving vehicles.

Financial Plan Impact

Funds are sufficient in the FY 2008 budget and proposed FY 2009 through FY 2012 budget and financial plan to implement the provisions of the proposed legislation. District agencies could absorb the expenditure impact of implementing the provisions of the proposed legislation with existing resources.
