## Conclusion

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2020 through fiscal year 2023 budget and financial plan to implement the resolution.

## Background

The resolution approves rulemaking<sup>1</sup> to make clarifications and updates to the District of Columbia Construction Codes ("DCCC"). The changes include new construction requirements that reflect advances in technology, engineering and safety practices. The changes were adopted by the District's Construction Codes Coordinating Board<sup>2</sup> as part of an approval process that allowed for public comments. The codes have not been comprehensively updated since 2014.

Among the changes, the updates align the DCCC with the Clean Energy DC Plan<sup>3</sup>, Sustainable DC 2.0<sup>4</sup>, and the Federal Emergency Management Agency's requirements for new construction and improvements on sites within flood hazard zones. The changes also include additional notifications
