#### Conclusion

Funds are not sufficient in the fiscal year 2021 through fiscal year 2024 budget and financial plan to implement the bill. The bill will cost \$171,000 in fiscal year 2021 and \$685,000 over the four-year financial plan.

### **Background**

The bill prohibits a licensed retail establishment from discriminating against cash as a form of payment. Establishments may not refuse to accept cash as a form of payment, post signs indicating that cash payment is not accepted, or charge a higher price to consumers who pay cash. Retailers that do not comply will be subject to civil penalties for unlawful trade practices.<sup>1</sup>

Sales made via phone, mail, or internet, and parking facilities that do not already accept cash as a form of payment are exempted from the prohibition. The bill also exempts all retailers from the prohibition during the period the Mayor has declared a public health emergency.

## **Financial Plan Impact**

Funds are not sufficient in the fiscal year 2021 through fiscal year 2024 budget and financial plan to implement the bill. The bill will cost \$171,000 in fiscal year 2021 and \$685,000 over the four-year financial plan.

The Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs (DCRA) will require resources to respond to tips of non-compliance, investigate complaints, proactively assess compliance, and enforce compliance. We do not have data on how many retailers are cashless operations. We estimate it will require 1 FTE, as well as contract funding for "mystery shoppers" at approximately 720 shops per year to proactively research and investigate compliance.
