

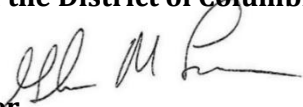

Conclusion

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2026 through fiscal year 2029 budget and financial plan to implement the bill.

Background

Alfred Dudley Sr. was an engineer who worked for the federal General Services Administration, National Institute of Health, and the United States Navy Department. He left the government to work in beauty sales with his brother, who ran Dudley Products, and became the top salesman in the company. In recognition of his successful sales career, he was recognized as President Emeritus at Dudley Beauty Corp, LLC. Dudley purchased and became the president of Dudley Beauty College, located at 2031 Rhode Island Avenue, N.E. In 2006, he received the Outstanding Individuals and Organizations for their Demonstrated Leadership in Business award from the Washington, D.C. chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People. Dudley died on May 21, 2023.

The bill symbolically designates Mills Avenue, N.E. from Hamlin Place, N.E. to Rhode Island Avenue, N.E. as Alfred Dudley Sr. Way. This block of Mills Avenue, N.E. runs alongside Dudley Beauty College.

Financial Plan Impact

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2026 through fiscal year 2029 budget and financial plan to implement the bill. The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) will fabricate and install three signs to symbolically designate the roadway as Alfred Dudley Sr. Way. The signs will cost \$570 and DDOT can absorb the cost within its existing budgeted resources.
