**Conclusion**

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2026 through fiscal year 2029 budget and financial plan to implement the bill.

**Background**

Safe Shores is the designated DC Children's Advocacy Center (CAC), and it is the place where multidisciplinary teams<sup>1</sup> charged with responding to child abuse meet to share information, gather facts, and assist child victims of severe physical or sexual abuse. Safe Shores is a nationally accredited CAC through the National Children's Alliance. The bill mandates<sup>2</sup> the use of an accredited CAC during multidisciplinary team investigations. The bill also establishes an annual reassessment and designation of the District's CAC.

**Financial Plan Impact**

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2026 through fiscal year 2029 budget and financial plan to implement the bill. There is no cost to require the CAC to be accredited, and the Child and Family Services Agency can reassess the CAC designation annually without additional resources.
