#### **Conclusion**

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2020 through fiscal year 2023 budget and financial plan to implement the bill.

### **Background**

The bill expands the Deputy Mayor for Planning and Economic Development's (DMPED) grant making authority to include grants to Check It Enterprises (Check It),<sup>1</sup> an organization located in Ward 8, for the purpose of purchasing three properties located along Martin Luther King, Jr. Avenue, S.E.<sup>2</sup> These properties are currently leased by Check It, We Act Radio,<sup>3</sup> and The District Culture.<sup>4</sup> DMPED must include in the grant agreement with Check It that the organization will enter into lease agreements of no less than five years with We Act Radio and The District Culture following its

acquisition of the properties<sup>5</sup> and offer lease rates identical to those each organization paid prior to the Check It acquisition. Check It can also offer to each organization an optional lease extension of no less than five years that includes a rate increase of no more than 5 percent.

If We Act Radio or The District Culture cease operations at this location, then Check It must either lease the properties to other social enterprises<sup>6</sup> or repay the grant to the District. To enforce this provision the Mayor can pursue any available remedies under law. The bill also grants the District the right of first refusal if Check It seeks to sell the property.

## **Financial Plan Impact**

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2020 through fiscal year 2023 budget and financial plan to implement the bill. The bill authorizes DMPED to issue grants to Check It for the acquisition of three properties along Martin Luther King, Jr. Avenue, S.E. The fiscal year 2020 budget includes \$2 million for DMPED to issue these grants, but the funding is currently part of the Paygo capital budget<sup>7</sup> and needs to be reprogrammed to the operating budget. There are no costs associated with giving DMPED this grant making authority, but DMPED will not have funds to grant until the reprogramming is approved.
