



**Conclusion**

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2025 through fiscal year 2028 budget and financial plan to implement the bill.

**Background**

Joseph P. Yeldell was a math teacher at Coolidge High School who was appointed to the city council by President Lyndon B. Johnson in 1967. After serving on the city council, Yeldell worked for Mayors Walter Washington and Marion Barry. Yeldell ran the District's Department of Human Resources, Office of Emergency Preparedness, and Department of Employment services. He also served as assistant city administrator and was a general assistant to the mayor. Mr. Yeldell died on April 15, 2013.

The bill symbolically designates North Portal Drive, N.W. between Tamarack Street, N.W. and 16<sup>th</sup> Street, N.W. as Joseph P. Yeldell Plaza.

**Financial Plan Impact**

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2025 through fiscal year 2028 budget and financial plan to implement the bill. The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) will fabricate and install two signs to symbolically designate the roadway as Joseph P. Yeldell Plaza. The signs will cost \$380 and DDOT can absorb the cost within its existing budgeted resources.
