



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**Conclusion**

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2026 through fiscal year 2029 budget and financial plan to implement the bill.

**Background**

Lenora Baker was an active member of the District of Columbia's Southwest Waterfront community. Ms. Baker was a volunteer at local schools including Amidon-Bowen Elementary, Jefferson Middle School Academy, and Richard Wright Public Charter School. She also served as a deaconess and cook at Westminster Presbyterian Church.

The bill symbolically designates 3<sup>rd</sup> Street, S.W. between I Street, S.W. and M Street, S.W. as Lenora Baker Way.

**Financial Plan Impact**

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2026 through fiscal year 2029 budget and financial plan to implement the bill. The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) will fabricate and install seven signs to symbolically designate the roadway as Lenora Baker Way. The signs will cost \$580 and DDOT can absorb the cost within its existing budgeted resources.
