Conclusion

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2026 through fiscal year 2029 budget and financial plan to implement the bill.

Background

An Individualized Rehabilitation Plan (IRP) is developed for each youth committed to the custody of the Department of Youth and Rehabilitative Services (DYRS). The bill requires¹ DYRS to make a recurring effort, at least every six months, to contact a committed youth's parent, guardian, or custodian and inform them of the youth's progress on their IRP. DYRS must keep an electronic log of all reasonable efforts made to contact the youth's parent, guardian, or custodian and must provide this electronic log to the Chair of the Council committee with oversight of DYRS upon request.

Financial Plan Impact

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2026 through fiscal year 2029 budget and financial plan to implement the bill. DYRS already regularly informs parents, guardians, and custodians about a

committee youth's progress on their IRP. DYRS can keep an electronic log of this progress with existing resources. No additional resources are required to implement the bill.
