**Conclusion**

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2025 through fiscal year 2028 budget and financial plan to implement the bill.

**Background**

Rev. A. Knighton Stanley was a civil rights leader<sup>1</sup> who served as the senior minister at Peoples Congregational United Church of Christ for nearly forty years, beginning in 1968. Stanley served as a special assistant to Mayor Walter E. Washington, was a trustee of the University of the District of Columbia, served on the nominating committee for District judges, and led the District's 1975 bicentennial efforts. Stanley died on September 21, 2013.

The bill symbolically designates Iowa Avenue, N.W. between 13<sup>th</sup> Street, N.W. and Arkansas Avenue, N.W. as Rev. A. Knighton Stanley Way. The Peoples Congregational United Church of Christ is located along this block.

### **Financial Plan Impact**

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2025 through fiscal year 2028 budget and financial plan to implement the bill. The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) will fabricate and install two signs to symbolically designate the roadway as Rev. A. Knighton Stanley Way. The signs will cost \$380 and DDOT can absorb the cost within its existing budgeted resources.
