Conclusion

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2025 through fiscal year 2028 budget and financial plan to implement the bill.

Background

The amends District law¹ to define a “living donor” as an individual who donates all or part of an organ or tissue and who is not deceased. The bill further prohibits a company providing life insurance, disability insurance, or long-term care insurance from denying coverage, refusing to issue a policy, or determining a price or term for coverage based solely on a person’s status as a living donor. This provision would apply to policies issued after January 1, 2026.

Financial Plan Impact

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2025 through fiscal year 2028 budget and financial plan to implement the bill. The Department of Insurance, Securities and Banking regulates insurers doing business in the District and does not require any new regulatory resources due to the changes in the bill.
