



**Conclusion**

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2024 through fiscal year 2027 budget and financial plan to implement the bill.

**Background**

Richard Bruce Sladen was born and lived his whole life on Capitol Hill at 120 11<sup>th</sup> Street, S.E. Sladen worked with the Capitol Hill Group Ministry assisting his elderly neighbors and residents at the D.C. Jail. He also worked to maintain the appearance and cleanliness of the parks and alley abutting his home. Sladen died in April 1981. The alley is currently known as Sladen’s Walk.

The bill officially designates the alley system located within the block bounded by 11<sup>th</sup> Street, S.E., East Capitol Street, S.E., 12<sup>th</sup> Street, S.E., and Independence Avenue, S.E. as Sladen’s Court.

**Financial Plan Impact**

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2024 through fiscal year 2027 budget and financial plan to implement the bill. The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) will fabricate and install three signs and poles to officially designate the roadway as Sladen’s Court. The signs and poles will cost \$1,380 and DDOT can absorb the cost within its existing budgeted resources.

The official designation will allow property owners with properties or dwelling units accessible only through the alley system to obtain addresses for those properties or units.
