



Conclusion

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2023 through fiscal year 2026 budget and financial plan to implement the bill.

Background

Hall Wooten, along with his wife, was a civic leader in the District's Eckington and Edgewood neighborhoods. Hall was a co-founder of the Edgewood/4th Street chapter of the Citizens Organized Patrol Efforts (C.O.P.E.) Anti-Drug/Crime Patrol Group. Hall Wooten died on July 14, 2010.

The bill officially designates the alley system located within the block bounded by 3rd Street, N.E., V Street, N.E., 4th Street, N.E., and W Street, N.E. as Wooten Court.¹

Financial Plan Impact

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2023 through fiscal year 2026 budget and financial plan to implement the bill. The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) will fabricate and install five signs at each of the alley system's entrances to officially designate the alley as Wooten Court. The signs cost \$950 and DDOT can absorb the cost within its existing budgeted resources.

¹ The alley system is wholly contained within the area known for tax purposes as Square 3562.
