#### Conclusion

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2023 through fiscal year 2026 budget and financial plan to implement the bill.

## **Background**

The bill prohibits<sup>1</sup> District of Columbia health occupation licensing boards from taking adverse or disciplinary action against a person permitted to practice in the District but whose license, registration, or certification was revoked, suspended, or restricted by another state because they provided or facilitated:

- An abortion or other reproductive health care;
- Interventions that support or affirm a person's gender identity; and
- Prescribing medication which is illegal, restricted, or denied in another state or jurisdiction, but is permitted in the District.

The bill also requires that health occupation licensing boards expedite the review of licensure, certification, or registration for health professionals seeking to practice in the District whose certification, license, or registration was suspended or revoked due to providing, facilitating, or attempting to provide or facilitate the procedures outlined above.

# **Financial Plan Impact**

Funds are sufficient in the fiscal year 2023 through fiscal year 2026 budget and financial plan to implement the bill. Prohibiting adverse or disciplinary action against a person permitted to practice a health care occupation in the District but whose license, registration, or certification was revoked, suspended or restricted in another state because of providing certain procedures does not have a cost. Likewise expediting the review of licensure, certification, or registration for health professionals seeking to practice in the District whose certification, license, or registration have been suspended or revoked due to providing, facilitating, or attempting to provide or facilitate certain procedures does not have a cost.
