### Conclusion

Funds are sufficient in the proposed FY 2010 through FY 2013 budget and financial plan to implement the provisions of the proposed resolution.

#### Background

The proposed resolution would approve rules<sup>1</sup> adopted by the Director of the Department of Human Services (DHS) that set forth the intake process, eligibility criteria, client rights and responsibilities, provider standards, and appeal procedures for the District of Columbia's Shelter and Supportive Housing Program. These rules would be detailed in a new Chapter 25 (Shelter and Supportive Housing for Individuals and Families) of Title 29 (Public Welfare) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations and would replace the current Chapter 25 in its entirety.

### Financial Plan Impact

Funds are sufficient in the proposed FY 2010 through FY 2013 budget and financial plan to implement the provisions of the proposed resolution. These rules reflect current procedures and

do not add any new responsibilities for Providers<sup>2</sup> or the District of Columbia Government, including DHS, the Office of Shelter Monitoring, and the Office of Administrative Hearings. As such, they do not have a cost. In addition, the rules clearly state that two new programs—the Permanent Supportive Housing Program and Systems Transformation Initiative Program—are subject to annual appropriations and the availability of funds. Therefore, this resolution has no fiscal impact.
